10:00 am Tour the **Warren County History Museum** at 238 South Sunnyslane. Enjoy a guided tour of the large display of antique farm

tools and equipment including a Pattee plow, Monmouth Plow, 1838 plow, and a Brown Planter. View the one room school house, and Grandma's room. Allow up to one hour for the tour. (Donations accepted, restrooms available)



11:00 pm **Buchanan Center for the Arts** located on the public square hosts a wide range of exhibitions from local amateurs to world

renowned artists. Tuesday mornings you can watch the Tromp As Writ Weavers Guild weave on their looms housed at the Buchanan Center for the Arts. (No charge, donations accepted, tours by appointment)

11:45 **Cerar's Barnstormer Steakhouse & Lounge**, for a lunch buffet. Enjoy one of the finest restaurants in West Central Illinois located at 1201 West Broadway.



1:15 pm **Street rods and muscle cars** are created at **Metal Crafters**. Tour their shop to learn how cars are restored

and rebuilt. Discuss laser cutting, sheet

metal fabrication, sand blasting, and the new paint booth. Their cars have been featured in national magazines. (No charge for tours, tours by appointment)



2:30 pm Tour **Maple City Pottery**, 620 South Main Street, and learn how stoneware is fashioned and decorated by hand. Visit their store. (No charge for tours, by appointment only)

3:30 pm Arrive at **Petey's**, #2 AmericInn Way, Suite A, for an afternoon sweet treat of Harvey's Famous homemade pie. Choose from coconut cream or the berry pie of the day.

Arrive at the **Maple City Bake Shop**, 226 South Main Street for an afternoon sweet treat of a unique cupcake creation or gourmet cookies.

Additional Tour Options

Have a wonderful stroll on a walking tour of the beautiful **Monmouth College** campus to view art sculptures and visit the **Len G. Everett Galleries**. Gallery 203 houses the Shields collection of art and antiquities, and Gallery 204 houses temporary exhibitions by world class artists as well as faculty and student displays. (No charge for tours, tours by appointment)



100 years of history can be found at the **Horse & Buggy Museum**. The museum offers exhibits and programs from the period of

1820-1920 when horses were the main source of power for farming and transportation. You'll find over 50 pieces of machinery displayed. Check out the eight interactive kiosks with over 80 Video Clips which make the draft horse era come alive again. (\$5/ person charge, tours by appointment) (Located in Biggsville ,15 minutes from Monmouth)

The first national secret society of women, Pi Beta Phi, was born in Monmouth. Tour the **Holt House**, the restored home of Pi Beta Phi and learn about it's beginning and the mission of it's founders. (No Charge, tours by appointment)

Kappa Kappa Gamma founded in 1870 is one of the earliest women's fraternities and was significant in the progression of the women's movement. The **Stewart House**, home of one of Kappa Kappa Gamma's six founders is open for tours by appointment. (\$2 donation/person)

The **Wyatt Earp Birthplace Home** serves as a museum for Wyatt Earp featuring displays, historical documents and memorabilia that tell of Wyatt Earp's life—fact and legend. (Tours \$3/person, tours by appointment only)
